This project is committed to support the engoing reform process in Myanman's forest sector with a clear focus on delivering a national forest certification system. By working in partnership with local organizations to develop and test tools that support legal, sustainable and transparent forest product trade, the project will build capacity while illustrating best practice. This approach will deliver tangible, small-scale impact in the short-term, but also greatly influence the longer-term reform process.

The project is designed to work within and between several of the projects and initiatives currently ongoing in the country, By increasing the coordination between the many related donor-funded projects and private sector activities, the project seeks to improve cross learning and support partners to collectively and effectively feed into the national certification system developments and the origining forest sector retorm processes underway by the newly formed Ministry of Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation (MONREC).

The project also seeks to respond to the recognized need to give further attention to the development and rollout of practical tools and pilot projects which can support forest sector actors to deliver forest conservation and sustainable forest management with supply chain verification in the immediate form.
